

CRIME AWARENESS & CAMPUS SECURITY ACT

The security of all school members is a priority. Each year on October 1st, as required by the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990, as amended, Chamberlain publishes a report outlining security and safety information, as well as crime statistics for the community. This report provides suggestions about crime-prevention strategies, as well as important policy information on emergency procedures, reporting of crimes and support services for victims of sexual assault. The report also contains information about Chamberlain's policy on alcohol and drugs and informs students where to obtain a copy of the alcohol and drug policy. Students should immediately report incidents to the local law-enforcement agency if they witness or are victims to a crime. Emergency numbers are located throughout the school. Students should immediately notify a campus colleague for assistance regarding any sudden illness, medical emergency or injury.
